

SAMPLE PUBLIC NOTICE
SWTR MONITORING VIOLATION

PUBLIC NOTICE

The **MAGNOLIA WATERWORKS** is a public water system subject to regulation under the federal Safe Drinking Water Act. Those regulations require the notification of customers whenever a violation occurs and is the basis for this notice.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency sets national standards for drinking water. Water for this system is from a surface source or groundwater which is directly influenced by surface water. Water systems which use these sources are required to monitor the disinfectant level of the water entering the distribution system one or more times each day. This monitoring is to help ensure that specific harmful microorganisms, if present, are not viable. This water system failed to meet the monitoring requirement for the disinfectant level on one or more days in **June 2020**.

Failure to meet this requirement does not mean that the water is unsafe or that alternate sources of water should be used. The water system has All CT criteria is being met at Wafa Treatment Plant.

This monitoring is to help prevent the growth of bacteria and to maintain the water in a potable condition. This monitoring and documentation is to help ensure that adequate disinfection is provided for protection against microorganisms.
